Reflection on Mission (Paradigm Shift God is calling us to make in missions)

The readings, lectures, assignments, and surveys have been very focused on the cultural attention necessary for missions. The material has been pointed in ways that it causes me to participate in a closer self-examination regarding cultural humility, cultural competence, and missional posture.

Entering the COS 423 class, I felt I had a reasonable understanding of mission with more than ten years of serving as a pastor and being engaged in disaster response in the world of emergency services over a multitude of deployments. The foundation I had was good; however, this foundation is stronger now as a result of this encountering of new material I have experienced in this class. Little did I know God would use an old text written in 1976 by Howard Thurman to step on my toes in a such a fashion as to open my eyes to see more clearly. What I expected to be a class instructing us in the technique of going forth to make disciples and sharing the love of Christ turned into a cultural awakening for me because of God's grace. The diversity of our class and instructional staff further contributed to this positive learning environment.

I am who I am and as a result; my ministry and mission may be perceived in an imperialistic manner despite my intentions. Imperialistic cultures cannot force change using their power or perceived power and influence. I am a forty something white male born in Georgia and raised in North Carolina. My life has been far from easy; however, I have worked to have a home, a successful bi-vocational career, and college education (two degrees at present). My efforts to reach the least, last, lost, and oppressed may be perceived as acts of charity or a promissory covenantal type action where one is considered to have greater power than the other. Thurman illustrates this in his text, *Jesus and the Disinherited*, related to a conversation about mission when asked of his motive. I must be aware as to avoid becoming or being perceived as culturally arrogant. I must understand the perceptions that may exist and work to overcome these perceptions that my ministry of mission is considered to be of pure motive.

God used the Intercultural Development Inventory to help me see self and the fields of ministry and mission in new ways with my eyes and heart. I understand now the need to be informed by many voices and to see in new ways. I must spend more time with the Beatitudes found in Matthew 5: 1-12 to more fully understand the field of mission and the corruption of the world in which we practice mission.

I understand we are called to be hearers and doers of the world in Matthew 7: 24-28. Essentially, we must be effective in the practice of that which is the love of Christ through forgiveness, love, and relationships. To do this, we first must rise above the barriers. I must be aware of self-imposed or perceived barriers because of my cultural identity and be open to the difference made visible through other cultures that I may be fully opened to the ministry of missions.
